The forum's plenary discussions will take place in Lucca's historic **Palazzo Ducale**, where participants will also be able to hang out and network in the **Living Lab Living Room** with other rural-urban thought leaders. Here participants will:

- explore the interconnections and interdependencies between rural and urban areas by asking: Why are urban-rural linkages so important? What is there to win and lose?
- examine ways of working together with new rural-urban governance models and supportive public policies, including a practitioner-led session that discusses realworld implementation challenges;
- look for new and innovative ways to connect rural and urban areas in practice, from new business models to new service delivery methods.

Thematic **field workshops** will be hosted at various locations in the Lucca Plain: a working urban farm, a cooperative olive oil mill, a repurposed Tuscan farm. Continue your discussions into the night during a traditional meal in Lucca's city centre.




